

Sports Premium Grant Report: 2016/17

The PE and sport premium is designed to help primary schools make additional and sustainable improvements to the provision of PE and sport activities for the benefit of all pupils to encourage the development of healthy, active lifestyles. £8,000 is received by each school, plus an additional £5 per pupil in years 1 to 6.

At Field View, children have access to a wide-ranging PE curriculum and a range of sports based extra curricular clubs. From an early age, competitive sport is nurtured and encouraged as we work with PASS Wolverhampton (Partnerships and School Sport) and WASPS (Wolverhampton Association for Sport in Primary Schools). Tournaments are also organised across the trust schools to enhance the opportunities for pupils to take part in competitions. A coherent programme of study is designed to provide pupils with a variety of opportunities to improve their knowledge and skills. Investment from the sports premium goes into some sports equipment to ensure a greater variety of PE that the school already offer, and to ensure that appropriate staff training is in place.

Skills are taught through PE lessons and through a variety of sports provision offered after school, through a combination of specialist sports staff and teachers. There are teams that are run (for example football and netball) throughout the year, that take part in competitions and leagues. There are also 'one-off' tournaments that pupils take part in (for example gymnastics, dodgeball and cricket) to enable a range of opportunities throughout the school year. As well as this, there are locally arranged events to encourage children to enjoy sports and physical activities with pupils from other schools (for example dance and multi-sports).

Funding is allocated to equipment and to subsidise staff roles to encourage a healthy lifestyle throughout the day, particularly at play times.

The allocation was spent on the following:

In 2017/18 the focus will be on further raising the profile of sports and PE across the school and to provide an even greater range of extra-curricular activities. There will be further investment in the professional development of staff and we will explore the possibility of appointing a Physical Activity Leader apprentice to support with promoting healthy lifestyles with pupils and their families. Another area for development in 2017/18 will be to improve the systems in place that are used to monitor and record the impact of the PE and Sports Premium funding.
