Spelling / Handwriting

Each term your child will be sent home with a spelling and handwriting booklet to complete. The booklet will contain a list of spellings which children need to learn how to read and write in preparation for their weekly spelling test. It also contains a handwriting practise sheet to help children improve their handwriting and presentation of work in class. At the beginning of the year, your child will be given a list of words they should know by the end of the year which you can practise with your child on a regular basis.

Maths

Every Friday your child will be given a piece of maths homework to complete at home. This will be something that they have already covered in school. The homework needs to be completed for the following Monday.

Don't forget...

Your child will be heard read every week in school and this will supplement reading activities in lessons. We would appreciate it, therefore, if you could ensure your child brings their reading book and record into school every day.

PE for Mrs Jones' class is every Wednesday and Mr Kandola's class is every Thursday. All children in year 3 will continue to have swimming every Friday.

The Romans invade....!!!

Ever wondered where our roads, money, government and many more things came from? Ever heard of Julius Caesar? The children will be exploring the inner working of the Roman army and what made them so strong and fierce. Just like us he hated the weather but it didn't stop his army invading us!



Our Topic

This term children will learn about The Romans. We would like the children to create a thematic project related to this theme.

For example create:


- A Roman helmet and shield
- 3D Roman numerals
- Make an amphitheatre
- Build Hadrian's Wall
- Make the Coliseum
- Construct a Roman ship
- Create a roman mosaic

RE & PSHE

In this subject, the children will think about what makes an inspirational person and how even relatively ordinary people can make a stand and improve the lives of those around them. They will have the opportunity to consider the impact that religious beliefs can have on a believer's life and the lives of those who hear their story. The focus is on considering the characteristics of an inspiring person and then the study of particular examples of inspirational people.

Maths

In maths lessons children will be adding and subtracting using the tricky columns, multiplying and dividing sevenths, and looking at angles. We will also be continuing learning the grid method for multiplication and introducing children to negative numbers.



Children will be practising and recalling their 2, 3, 4, 5, 8, 9, 10 times table as well as their quick recall of basic maths facts. These are things you could help your child with at home.

Science

Our topic for science this half term is Magnets and Forces. The children will work scientifically and collaboratively to investigate friction, by exploring the movement of a toy car over different surfaces. They will work in a hands on way to identify magnetic materials. Furthermore, they will conduct an investigation into the strength of different types of magnets, creating and using their own magnet.

English

During English lessons children will be reading Icarus and Daedalus a Greek myth. The children will be writing image poetry, retelling the story and writing a diary as if they were living in Roman times.

Children will then be writing poems and information texts based on their reading. Children will enjoy using new vocabulary, adjectives and paragraphs.

Children will also be practising joining letters correctly and spelling words from the Year 3 word list correctly. You could help at home by practising handwriting with children and choosing some of the spellings from the Year 3 word list to practise with your child.

Reading

Your child will bring home a reading book to read to you. These books are chosen carefully based on assessments to help your child make the best progress with their reading.

We would appreciate it if you could listen to your child read regularly and record brief comments in their reading record to let the teacher know how your child is getting on.

Your child will also be bringing home a library book to share with you. These books are chosen by the children and so may sometimes be quite difficult or seemingly easy for them to read. These books are for you to enjoy with your child rather than expect them to be able to read them to you.
