Spelling / Handwriting

Each term your child will be sent home with a spelling and handwriting booklet to complete. The booklet will contain a list of spellings which children need to learn how to read and write in preparation for their weekly spelling test. It also contains a handwriting practise sheet to help children improve their handwriting and presentation of work in class. At the beginning of the year, your child will be given a list of words they should know by the end of the year which you can practise with your child on a regular basis.

Maths

Every Friday your child will be given a piece of maths homework to complete at home. This will be something that they have already covered in school. The homework needs to be completed for the following Monday.

Your child will be heard read every week in school and this will supplement reading activities in lessons. We would appreciate it, therefore, if you could ensure your child brings their reading book and record into school every day.

Blitz and Pieces

A siren sounds, a building crumbles, a Spitfire zooms overhead. Take cover! It's 1939 and Britain is at war. Deep down in the Anderson shelter, learn why nations are fighting and why child evacuees must make the long journey from their homes and families into unknown territory. And, as peace is declared, let's get ready to celebrate. Mr Churchill says 'It's an unconditional surrender!' In this exciting topic children will have the opportunity to learn about the Second World War which lasted from 1939 to 1945. They will identify the continents and countries involve in this war and investigate the impact the war had on our lives today.



Our Topic

This half term our topic is all about World War II. Children will be developing skills in all areas of the curriculum through this topic. They will be finding out about significant people and events from the past such as The Holocaust, Winston Churchill and King George VI.

They will be identifying the countries that were involved during the war and improving their map skills.

We will also be looking at the war artist Henry Moore and will be exploring sketching techniques.

We would love you to get involved and help your child get a better understanding of the topic.

There are many ways you can help your child such as:

- Researching online
- Exploring library books.

Reminders

PE will now be on a Thursday afternoon.

Please can all children remember to bring a full kit.
Can we remind you that ear rings should be taken out.

Also with the run up to SATS booster groups will be running in the morning, Monday to Thursday each week.

Maths

In maths lessons, children will be looking at the four operations involving decimals and fractions. We will also be using known facts to solve problems.

Children will also be exploring symmetry, translation rotation. We will be exploring position and direction and co-ordinates.

Children will be using all their prior knowledge to help them in the preparations for SATS. They will apply all these skills to help solve reasoning questions.

Science

Within Science this half a term we will have a science week where children will look at mental health, the reasons for it and techniques to help cope with mental health.

Children will look at the brain and hopefully talk part in calming activities such as yoga.

English

During English lessons children will be reading a range of rhyming verse poems. They will be discussing the different structural and language features and will be exploring a range of text features such as metaphors, similes, alliteration and the impact they have on the reader.

Children will also be looking at the story: 'The Chronicles of Narnia.' They will unpick the text to look at the setting, characters and lifestyle of World War II. There will be particular focus on expanded noun phrases, punctuation and organisational features.

Children will also be practising their handwriting on a daily basis to make their handwriting joined and legible ready for SATS.

Just a reminder that SATS week will be the week commencing Monday 11th May.

Reading

Your child will bring home a reading book to read to you. These books are chosen carefully based on assessments to help your child make the best progress with their reading.

We would appreciate it if you could listen to your child read regularly and record brief comments in their reading record to let the teacher know how your child is getting on.

Your child will also be bringing home a library book to share with you. These books are chosen by the children and so may sometimes be quite difficult or seemingly easy for them to read. These books are for you to enjoy with your child rather than expect them to be able to read them to you.
