Phonics

Every day your child will be having a phonics session where we introduce Set 1 or Set 2 sounds. When your child has learnt to recognise the first few sounds we begin reading simple words using these. Each week we will send home some letters or words for your child to practise reading and writing. As they progress through the sounds they will then have simple sentences or phonics books to practise reading with you.

Reading

Whilst your child is learning to read it is still important that they look at books and listen to different stories. Each week on a Monday the children will be able to go to our library and choose a book to bring home to share with you. Please make sure they bring their library books back every Monday to choose a new book.

Don't forget...

Physical development is an important part of the Early Years Curriculum and supports children at this age with developing other skills, particularly writing. Every Monday the children will have a P.E lesson and will need to have a black pumps in school (P.E Kit is provided by school).

As the weather will hopefully getting warmer we will need pumps in school, and the green school hooded P.E tops as we may be doing some P.E outside. Please make sure everything is clearly labelled with your child's name in.

Also – Forest Fridays – Please bring in clothes that can get dirty – Wellies/Trainers and a labelled carrier bag to put dirty shoes/clothes in!

We break up for half term on Friday 24th May and return Monday 3rd June.

Monday 29th April is an inset day and Monday 6th May is a Bank Holiday.

Once upon a time there were **Three Little Pigs** and the time came for them to leave home and seek their fortunes.


A story with lots of repetition –

6th May 2019 Traditional Tales

This is a fable everyone should know!
We will be retelling the story so being familiar with the tale is important.
You can find the story online as well.
You could also talk to your child about the different materials used to make the houses.



Maths Makes Sense

In Maths lessons, we will continue to work on finding one more and one less up to 20 and solving addition and subtraction Maths Stories. We will also be working on introducing the concept of $\frac{1}{2}$ and using $\frac{1}{2}$ cups to add and take away. In Shape, Space and Measure, we will continue to talk about and name 2D and 3D shapes and will work on using language to talk about time.

At home you could support your child in Maths by talking about half of objects.



Maybe you could share a biscuit by cutting it in half! You could also do some cooking together at home and talk about using half a cup of flour, or a bowl being half-full.

On your way to school. You could talk about what your child will do in the morning, in the afternoon, after school and in the evening.

13th March 2019 Traditional Tales

'Jack and the Beanstalk' A Traditional Tale.

Another familiar story with lots of repeated parts. "Fee-fi-fo-fum!"

"I smell the blood of an English man"
A story about a poor boy who sells a cow for magic beans. Mom was not happy – until the very next day when they saw the magic beanstalk.
