Let's Celebrate

When was the last time you celebrated something -: a birthday, a festival or a particular time of year? Celebrations are an important part of human life. They are one of the things that make us uniquely human. What do you celebrate? Join in the fun as we celebrate through learning!

Our Topic

This half term, children will have the opportunity to explore their experiences of celebrations at home, with friends, in school and in the local and wider community. They will begin to appreciate and respect the diversity that exists in society and the positive contributions of various cultural and religious groups.

They will identify celebrations from different countries, taste food, research particular past events and how they are still celebrated, design and make decorations, take part in and hold celebrations and so much more!

We would love you to get involved and help your child get a better understanding of the topic. There are many ways you can help your child such as:

- Talk and share family celebrations
- Research celebrations around the world.

PSHE & RE

In PSHE children will be learning about Safe Relationships including recognising privacy; staying safe and seeking permission.

In RE as we build up to Christmas we will be looking at the traditional Christmas story and other stories from the bible.

Maths

In maths lessons, children will be adding and subtracting; using measures such as dm, cm and m; using concrete objects to multiply and using positional language to talk about objects.



Children will also be practising counting forwards and backwards in 1s, 2s, 5s and 10s and recalling number bonds to 5, 10, 20, 100, 1000 and 10, 000 using body counting. These are things you could help your child with at home.

Science

Our topic for science this half term is Animals and Us and Seasonal Changes.

We will be identifying different parts of the body and how our senses help us in daily life. We will also look at seasonal changes for Autumn and Winter and make a Rain collector.



English

During English lessons children will explore reading the following stories; The Story of Rama and Sita: Twas the Night Before Christmas and other Christmas stories. You could help children at home by talking about the order of events in stories they are familiar with.

Children will be writing a shape poem about Fireworks and Christmas using adjectives and nouns, writing simple sentences to describe the celebration with capital letters and full stops.

Children will also be practising forming lowercase and capital letters correctly and spelling words from the year 1 word list correctly. You could help at home by practising handwriting with children and choosing some of the spellings from the year 1 word list to practise with your child.

Reading

Your child will get the opportunity to read to both their teacher and teaching assistant regularly. This will be recorded in school and used as evidence to assess their ability and track progression.

Children have a daily phonics lesson, where they learn a new sound. A video link will be shared via Marvellous Me each day so you can practise the sound with your children at home. During phonics lessons, children also read a book within their group. When children start a new book, they will bring a copy of the book home with them. Please read this as often as possible and bring it back at the end of each week so that we can replace it with the next book.
