Globe Trotting!

What is beyond the borders of this tiny island that we know as home? What can be found throughout the world that we live in? Who was brave enough to explore the world? Find out all about the explorers who wanted to find out more, the artists who changed the world and explore how to create your own video!



Our Topic

This half term our topic is all about exploring the world. Children will be developing skills in all areas of the curriculum through this topic. They will be finding out about significant people past such as Sir Francis Drake, Christopher Columbus and Sir Walter Raleigh.

They will be identifying the countries that they travelled to and will be looking at how they have impacted life today.

We will also be looking at a range of artists from around the world and will be exploring the techniques they used to create their works of art.

We would love you to get involved and help your child get a better understanding of the topic.

There are many ways you can help your child such as:

- Researching online
- Exploring library books.

RE

In RE this term we will be looking at why different religions go on a special journey. We will look at the journeys that Hindus, Sikh and Jews take in their lifetime and why. Children will also reflect on their own journeys through life.

Maths

In maths lessons children will be looking at methods to multiply, divide, add and subtract and will be applying them to problems. We will also be looking at the area of ratio and will be exploring fractions too.



Children will also be looking at graphs and the data they provide us with.

In geometry, we will be looking at shapes and how they can be 'transformed'.

Science

In science this term we will be looking at living things and organisms. We will look at the habitats of different animals, the types of food different animals eat and why? We will also look at classifying different animals and plants.



English

During English lessons children will be reading a range of list poems. They will be discussing the different structural and language features and will be exploring a range of text features such as metaphors, similes, alliteration and the impact they have on the reader.

Children will also be looking at the story An Edwardian Girl's diary 1912. They will unpick the text to look at the setting, characters and how to develop a good diary entry. There will be particular focus on tenses: ensuring children are using the correct tense throughout the story. Children will also look at subordinate and relative clauses throughout grammar lessons.

Children will also be practising their handwriting on a daily basis to make their handwriting joined and legible ready for SATS.

Reading

Your child will be heard reading an appropriately pitched book in class regularly. This will be kept in their tray and they will have access to it throughout the day. Once they have finished reading their book, they will take a short quiz on the iPad / laptop to check their understanding.

We will be sending home library books for you to share with your child. These books are to foster a love of reading so may not be pitched appropriately for your child. We would appreciate it if you could share this book with them and once completed return it to school.

At this time, we will not be sending reading records.
